Juma Sultan - Creative Director

Juma Sultan is a culture bearer like no other.

He may be best known for his work with Jimi Hendrix at Woodstock, and before that, as a pioneer of the New York "loft jazz" scene in 1960s.

Juma is a modern day griot and in that capacity opens his heart to his students, his fans, and the world.

#### Avery Sharpe



Avery Sharpe is a prolific composer and band leader. In 1980 he won a spot in McCoy Tyner's group, playing hundreds of gigs worldwide and appearing on more than 20 recordings.

Sharpe has collaborated with Dizzy Gillespie, Wynton Marsales, Yusef Lateef, Bobby McFerrin, Pat Metheny, and Billy Taylor.

He has lectured at the University of Massachusetts, Williams College, Berklee School of Music, Bates College, the University of Miami, and at colleges in Peru, Brazil, Australia and elsewhere.

His awards include The NAACP Martin Luther King Jr Special Achievement Award, several National Endowment for the Arts Grants and the New England Foundation for the Arts Achievement in Jazz Award.



#### Mayra Casales

Mayra Casales was born in Havana, Cuba, and grew up in Miami. She studied with Carlos "Patato" Valdés and performed with Celia Cruz, Machito and Tito Puente.

Moving to New York City, she was able to connect with jazz greats like **Dizzy Gillespie, Wayne Shorter** and **Ray Barretto**.

In 2008, Mayra founded the all-women Latin band Cocomama.



# **OUR FACULTY**

Charlie Apicella - Program Director, head writer

Charlie Apicella was voted onto the 84th and 86th DownBeat Readers Poll for Guitar. He is Vice President of Education for the North Jersey Blues Society.

He studied composition and improvisation with musical titans Yusef Lateef and Pat Martino and was trained as a historian by Archie Shepp and Dr. Billy Taylor. As a young guitarist he met his idol BB King, who offered him advice and shared some stories.

Charlie has written two lessons for DownBeat, one for Just Jazz Guitar, and has developed his own guitar and history curriculum, Solid Guitar, for Jazz Anywhere and TrueFire. He's been on the faculty of New York Jazz Workshop for more than ten years.

## Amy Bateman - Director of Applied Music, curriculum developer
